Provincial Changes to Grade 10

- Anti-Racism Mandatory Holocaust Curriculum
- The changes will take effect in the 2025-26 school year to allow for adequate consultation.
- •The scope of the Grade 10 Social Studies curriculum may also be broadened to include additions that reflect the diversity and history of British Columbia, including topics such as; learning related to the Japanese Internment and discrimination against culturally diverse groups such as Muslim, East Asian, Black and South Asian communities.


Career Development
