- This will bring an additional 126K to our district



Secondary School Cross Boundary Process

- This process has been in effect for elementary for a long time
- Prior to reconfiguration, there was no need for a cross boundary for secondary schools
- Exceptional circumstances not the norm

What is new?

- A new Administrative Procedure is currently in draft form
- New cross boundary requests must be submitted by March 31st
- Priority will be given to:
 - First Nation Students at a designated "School of Choice"
 - A catchment area student who has moved into the area
 - A non-catchment area student
 - A non-district student
