FRENCH IMMERSION AND YOUR CHILD

There will be an essential information meeting for the Late French Immersion on Tuesday, March 6 at 6 p.m.

Principals, district staff, teachers, and students will present information about each program and provide registration information. These meetings are for parents of students new to French Immersion.

Late Immersion (Grade 6)

École intermédiaire Shuswap / Shuswap Middle School (171 30th St. SE, Salmon Arm)

It is important that parents and students attend this meeting.



If there are between 24 and 28 students (1 class) or between 48 to 56 (2 classes) students with their parents at the information session, all students will be automatically registered.

If the numbers do not work out for either 1 or 2 classes, we will continue with registration on Wednesday, April 5, 2017 from 7 a.m. to 9 a.m. Registration will take place at the District Education Support Centre (DESC) located at 341 Shuswap St. S.W., Salmon Arm on a first come first served basis. After 9 a.m. registration will be accepted at École intermédiaire Shuswap.

If you already have a child in French Immersion, siblings should be registered through the sibling registration process. Deadline is February 17, 2017.

- Immersion programs (both Early and Late) are designed for students from any catchment area in SD#83 whose first language is other than French.
- Parents need NOT speak French.

• Students are encouraged to stay in the program through Grade 12 in

order to attain a high degree of bilingualism and to receive a bilingual Dogwood Graduate Certificate.

• The program is NOT operating separately from the normal functioning of the school. Students in the French Immersion program will participate in regular school activities.

PROGRAM GOALS

- To develop language skills enabling students to participate easily in French conversation.
- To provide an insight into the French culture.
- To achieve skills in all subject areas equivalent to those in the English program.
- Ability to take post-secondary education with French as the language of instruction.
- Ability to gain employment using French as the work language.
- * Out-of catchment transportation to French Immersion programs is the responsibility of the parents.

COMMON QUESTIONS about French Immersion programs in our schools

What are the benefits of learning a second language?

- \checkmark Learning a second language develops your child's listening and learning skills as well as their self discipline
- √ It increases their cognitive abilities by helping them to become more flexible thinkers.
- √ It enhances their knowledge of and their ability to communicate in their first language.
- √ It makes learning a third and fourth language easier.
- \checkmark It can provide opportunities for future employment or career advancement.

What about the students' academic achievements?

- √ Research shows there is absolutely no detrimental effect on academic performance in any subject area despite learning in a new language.
- √ Students gain larger English vocabulary as French words are often similar to English words.

What will happen to my child's first language?

The authors of "Yes You Can Help! Information and Inspiration for French Immersion Parents", Pat Brehaut and Judy Gibson have concluded that the results of 30 years of studies undertaken from St. John's to Victoria are clear and consistent. Early Immersion students tend to lag behind English-program students in more technical aspects of the language (punctuation and spelling) until they have a year or two of English Language Arts. However, by Grade 5 or 6 (even if this subject is not introduced until grade 4), they perform as well as their English-program peers

In School District 83 some students perform equal to the English students and/or sometimes outperform them with respect to English language communication and reading by Grade 5 or 6.

How does Late Immersion compare with Early French Immersion?

- √ Late French Immersion is not a continuation of Early French Immersion. It is a
 separate program, offered in addition to Early Immersion, which provides an
 alternative final entry point for English students who want to become bilingual.
- √ In Grade 8, the Early and Late Immersion students join together into one program. The two groups become academically cohesive during the secondary years.
