

Cell Phone Restrictions

- Ministry of Education and Child Care requires all School Districts to have a cell phone procedure in place by August 15, 2024.
- The Ministry of ECC is working with the Ministry of Justice regarding intimate images and social media.
- Each district across the province will need to have an Administrative Procedure which restricts the use of cell phones in classrooms.
- The intention is to provide space for disconnection, especially in the younger grades.
- "Safety for kids" is the driver behind this change.
- Ministry direction will be communicated by April 1st (after consultation).
- The Ministry recognizes the appropriate educational use of cell phones as tools for learning and assistive technology.
- SD83 will be establishing a working group to develop guidelines for cell phone use within our schools.
- Schools will be required to include this within their Codes of Conduct.
