


Requests for Consideration

- To renew the commitment to prevent further deaths, injuries and diseases by improving health and safety in the workplace





Young Workers In BC Lack knowledge of dangers of work and their rights as workers From 2010-2014 there were 32,000 young workers injured and 29 work related deaths Every week, 7 young workers are permanently disabled Young males between the ages of 15-24 are twice as likely to get injured on the job The highest rate of injury occurs in the hospitality, retail and construction industry
