School District 83 Greenway Trail Planning

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Purpose:

The purpose of this phased project is to formalize existing urban connector trails, which cross through School District 83 (SD83) property and incorporate them into the City of Salmon Arm (City) Greenways trail network. These "Social Routes" are currently used heavily by the general public, and students alike, and fit within the Salmon Arm Greenways strategy for pedestrian planning.

First steps will involve surveying SD83 property to identify the official, agreed upon, trail line for each proposed SD83 property. A formal Right-Of-Way agreement between the City of Salmon Arm and SD83 will be required, which will allow the City to assume liability and upgrade the trail routes to the Shuswap Trail Alliance (STA) trail standard, which follows the Recreation Sites and Trail BC (RSTBC) and Whistler trail standards.

Once complete, these trails should be suitable for pedestrians, bicycles, strollers, and wheelchairs as terrain permits. This will involve trail upgrades and improvements, installing wayfinding and informational signage, and on-going maintenance. The City would ensure that the necessary maintenance was completed on an ongoing basis, most often by contracting the STA to complete the work.

This proposal is suggesting a phased approach, targeting one campus per year as funds permit. The City of Salmon Arm currently has \$20,000 in reserved funds for this project and Brown Johnson has committed to provide surveying services of up to \$5,000 per year.

Proposed timeline of trail development:

- a) Jackson Campus 2023
- b) Sullivan Campus 2024
- c) Shuswap Middle School 2025
- d) Bastion School 2026

Background:

Greenways Overview

The City of Salmon Arm Greenways Trails are an interconnected network of greenways and trails, serving all forms of non-vehicular movement and all ability levels, linking the City Centre, neighbourhoods, and major points of interest with each other and with surrounding lands, and providing healthy transportation, outdoor recreation and tourism opportunities, and ecological connectivity.


The purpose of the Greenways Strategy is to provide direction for the long-term planning and implementation of a trail/path network spanning the City, integrated with the sidewalk and bicycle networks, and connecting to existing and future regional trails, to provide recreational opportunities, to accommodate alternative transportation for a diverse range of trail/path users, and to support corridors for ecological connectivity.

Heatmaps


Strava and Trailforks are activity tracking apps which are used to track recreational activities. Strava is used by 76 million people worldwide and Trailforks has 1,309,510 user profiles and 42,897,836 individual ride logs.

These apps are continuously generating data on ridership at very high spatial and temporal resolutions. Heatmaps can be thought of as a sample of bike and pedestrian volumes, where the sample is generated from app users.

The number of total bicyclists represented by one user count varies depending on location and should be combined with trail count programs for an accurate count.

Project Details:

Jackson Campus

The Turner Creek trail connects uptown Salmon Arm, starting near the Shuswap Middle School, to downtown along Turner Creek, through the Jackson Campus to McGuire Lake. This trail would be added to the Salmon Arm Greenways Maintenance Budget and maintained as a type 2 trail through SD83 property. There is a gap in the trail connection on the east end of the trail where the current trail enters the parking lot. It would be difficult to direct pedestrians around the parking lot as users will always default to the more efficient route from point A to Point B. We could create a trail along the edge of the parking lot and develop a true edge to this parking area taking the most desired pedestrian route in consideration for the trail alignment. The other option if to leave this trail gap as is.

Map of the existing trail through Jackson Campus




Trail Forks Heat Map of existing use


Sullivan Campus

Proposed trail alignment through the Sullivan campus



Construction Standards:


All work will be completed to the Shuswap Trail Design Standards (STA, 2008. aka Provincial/Whistler/IMBA Standards, 2003). The suggested trail types, descriptions to follow, are Type 2 and Type 3.

Type 2 Trail

- surfaced double-track or single-track trail
- machine built
- remove all embedded trail obstacles
- use crushed limestone with fines, well-compacted gravel, or existing old roadbeds
- clear width to 5.0m for double-track and 1.6m for single-track trails
- clear height to 2.4m

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
provide 2-3m tread width for double-track trails, 1m for single-track trails




Type 2 Trail Example
